Some proud moments

- *R v. Banting J.C. (Lieutenant)*, 2020 CMAC 2; 2019 CMAC 5: Crown acted negligently in seeking this appeal. Court awarded party-and-party costs.
- *Toth v. R*, 2019 FC 125: This Class Action lawsuit recovered \$100M in Charter damages in favour of disabled Canadian Forces veterans.
- *R v. Banting J.C. (Lieutenant)*, 2019 CM 2008; 2019 CM 2009: Code of Service Discipline charges were dismissed as the Prosecutors failed to demonstrate a *prima facie* case.
- Bill C-77 (Mar 2019): Appearance as a witness before the Senate Standing Committee on National Security and Defence in support Bill C-77 which abolished summary trials; and enshrined rights for military victims of crime
- *Price Public Hearing* (2016) MGERC: This case established the limitations on the presumption of innocence for a wrongly accused in a frivolous complaint of workplace sexual harassment.
- *Beddows v. R*, 2015 FC; 2016 FCA 294: This case established the test for when the interests of justice favour accepting a grievance beyond a statutory limitation period.
- *Winds of Change conference*: Part of the organizing team for the inaugural conference and debate on Canadian military law, hosted by the University of Ottawa in November 2015.
- *Bossé v. R*, 2015 FC 1143: This case expanded the test for reasonableness, to require that *all* central issues be decided upon by a decision maker.
- *Fynes Public Interest Hearing*, 2011-2012: Acted for the complainants in a nine-month public inquiry (96 witnesses), which resulted in systemic change in the Military Police's approach to sudden death investigations in Canada.
